GENERAL CONDITIONS

This show is held under the Rules and Regulations of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and the Rules and By-Laws of the Mossman and District Show Society Inc. (Although the substance of some of the Rules of the Society are set out here under, for emphasis and general direction, this Statement of Conditions shall not be deemed to be an exhaustive statement of the Rules and By-Laws of the Society, all of which shall be in full force and application.)

For particulars of Entry Fees, dates of closing of entries, dates and times for delivery of exhibits and special conditions relative to the particular Sections see the head notes to the individual Sections appearing in this schedule. Intending exhibitors are advised to read the Schedule carefully and to be sure to enter exhibits in the correct Classes.

MEMBERSHIP SUBSCRIPTION FAMILY tickets of \$45.00 carries the privilege of two adult tickets, plus a ticket for each of the Member's dependent children. Each ticket will admit the bearer to the Show throughout the whole period thereof (both Sunday and Monday) as often as desired. Tickets must be produced otherwise ordinary admission will be charged.

<u>ADULT SINGLE</u> tickets of \$25.00 are available to adults over 18 years of age. <u>CHILD SINGLE</u> tickets of \$10.00 are available to all school aged children. Such tickets will entitle admission to the grounds as above but no entitlement as Members of the Society.

PENSIONER (2) tickets are available for \$25.00. **PENSIONER SINGLE** tickets are available for \$15.00 Entrance to the grounds for **NON – MEMBERSHIP TICKET HOLDERS** will be charged at the **DAILY RATE**: Adults: \$20.00, Children: \$10.00 (Children under school age are admitted free). **Pensioners:** \$10.00 (Pensioners must present evidence of entitlement).

The Committee shall have full control of all personnel on the grounds, and through its' Stewards and other Officials, the conduct and management of the Show. Persons admitted or claiming to be admitted to the grounds shall be subject to the Regulations of the Committee; and the Committee reserves the right by its' Executive Officers, Stewards, or other Officials or nominees: -

- (a) To refuse to admit to the grounds or;
- (b) Expel and remove from the grounds any person or persons whose conduct (past or present) is in the opinion of such Committee, Executive Officer's, Stewards or other Officials or nominees such as to warrant such action.

Entries in the show must be made on the Entry Forms provided by the Society and must be in the hands of the Secretary by the stipulated date thereof, together with the Entry Fees without which no Entry will be accepted. Exceptions to this Rule will however, be made in such Sections (in particular the Horticulture, Agriculture and Culinary Sections) where the Stewards thereof on their discretion permit having reference in particular to time available for completion of Section Books and preparation for Judging. Exceptions will also be made in the case of the Ring Events where (with the exception of "Local" events) entries will be accepted up to such time as the Stewards in their absolute discretion deem fit.

In all Sections, it is a condition of entry that the Society will not under any circumstances, be held responsible for any loss, damage, or miss delivery of any livestock or other exhibit or exhibits at the Society's Show, or for any accident that may be caused through or by any exhibit. The arrangement of exhibits will be in the sole control of the Stewards. Exhibits entered in the wrong Class by the Exhibitor may be transferred to the proper Class by the Stewards.

The Judges may award Certificates of Commendation in addition to awards mentioned in the Schedule, or may withhold any Prize if in their opinion the exhibit is not of sufficient merit. The decision of the Judge or Judges

shall be final. The Committee reserves the right to substitute trophies donated after printing of Schedules in lieu of cash prizes.

Supplementary Schedules may be issued at the discretion of the Committee.

At all times the commencement of delivery of exhibits until the opening of the Hall for general exhibition the Hall shall be under the control of the stewards therein, who shall have full power to refuse admittance or cause expulsion from the Hall of any person or persons other than those who, in the opinion of the Stewards have lawful occasion to be in such Hall.

The Committee reserves the right to reduce Prize money for any event, or to cancel the event, if in the opinion of the Committee paucity of entries and/or competitors for such an event does not warrant the amount of Prize Money awarded.

The Society will not under any circumstances, be liable for any accident on the grounds or premises.

The Committee may refuse any entry without giving reasons for so doing.

Any person entering a protest in connection with the Show shall lodge the sum of \$50.00 with the Secretary. The onus of proof shall be with the Lodger of the protest. The Committee shall decide all protests and their decision shall be final. If in the opinion of the Committee the protest may be frivolous the deposit shall be forfeited. In the hearing of all protests and disputes arising out of an award, the Committee shall abide by the Judges books unless it is shown that the Judge has been willfully or accidentally mislead. Protests must be in writing and must be lodged with the Secretary before the day of judging. A protest in any particular class may only be made by a competitor in that class.

No exhibit may be removed before 7.00 pm on the Monday of the Show without the permission of the Section Stewards.

The Rules and By-Laws first above mentioned and the foregoing Statement of Conditions and the notes set forth in the Schedule hereafter appearing, are to be the conditions of the Show and of competition herein. The Committee, whose decision shall be final, shall determine any matter arising, not herein provided for.

ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES: The attention of intending exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and to the Constitution and Rules of this Society in addition to any special regulations which appear within this Schedule.

CULINARY HINTS

SCONES: Use a 5cm. floured cutter. Do not twist cutter, as it will cause uneven rising. For competitive work scones should not touch during baking. Glaze with milk or beaten egg yolk and milk. Appearance, uniformity of size, shape and height are important factors. Volume, well risen. Smooth, tender, even golden brown colour on top and base. Texture, light and flaky, medium fine grain. Crumb has silky sheen with good response to touch and colour is clean.

PUMPKIN SCONES: Use creaming method and dry blue pumpkin, wet pumpkin will make a heavy scone.

TEA CAKE: A flat shallow pan is required for a teacake and the traditional shape is round so that it can be cut into wedges. The teacake should be very light, have a fine even grain and a tender moist crumb. The top should have very little dome, that is, be fairly flat. The sides should be perfectly straight and clean.

PIKELETS: A pikelet is made from thin batter. A thin batter should have equal quantities of liquid and flour. The two surfaces should have a delicate golden brown skin with no large burst air bubbles. Pikelets should be free from blemishes. The Sides between the surfaces should be white and dry with no uncooked wet ring. They must be well risen and uniform in size and shape (round).

CHOCOLATE CAKE: Flavour and aroma should be rich chocolate. Dust tins with cocoa.

ORANGE CAKE: A creamed texture. Eggs with dark yolks to help give the cake a rich colour. The texture fine, soft and even. There should be no coarseness from too much orange juice.

PATTY CAKES: Small, dainty and attractive. Tops should be domed. Cauliflower tops will lose points. The colour delicate brown, skin fine and even.

BISCUITS: Biscuits are evaluated on mixture, appearance (shape, size, variety and thickness), crust, texture, colour inside, colour, aroma, decorations, originality and presentation. A biscuit is short, crisp, well flavoured, carefully mixed, well-shaped, cooked with quality ingredients and decorated beautifully.

PUMPKIN FRUIT CAKE: A creamed mixture butter cake. Spices and cocoa may be added. This cake should be golden yellow or spicy brown colour and fine skinned.

BOILED FRUIT CAKE: Not heavily fruited. Tins, 20cm. round or 18cm. square and 10cm. in height. Shiny top skin, colour should be even rich brown continuing from top to sides and base. Sides, smooth and vertical. Cake should cut without dragging out the fruit. Texture, fine, even, free from holes, firm and moist, fruit unidentifiable and uniform in quality and size and evenly distributed.

FRUIT CAKE: High points for a cake that will cut without crumbling and without loss of fruit. Texture, firm, moist, smooth, fine, even and free from holes. Not too moist or too dry. The top should be only slightly domed. The crust should be smooth and fine with no cracks or sugar specks. The sides should be smooth and vertical with no blemishes from careless papering. The base should be smooth. There should be no variation of the rich even brown colour, which the whole cake, top, sides and bottom should have. Fruit, evenly distributed, bright good quality, plump and fleshy, uniform in size and shape, not too large or too small and not minced or chopped beyond recognition. Cut raisins in half, leave sultanas and currants whole. Dust cut cherries with flour, cut almonds into slivers and prunes, dates, figs, ginger, glace, apricots and pineapple into small pieces. High points to correct fruit size. There should be no excess of spices or colourings.

COCONUT ICE: 113-116 degrees (soft boil) cool to lukewarm - 43 degrees. Use of glucose will prevent discolouring. Coconut should be white and fresh and in proportion. Pink layer should be delicate. Pieces approx. 25mm. square. Select pieces same size and shape.

FUDGE: 114-116 degrees. Cool to lukewarm - 43 degrees. Pieces approx 25mm square. Select pieces same size and shape.

MARSHMALLOWS: 130 degrees boil. The texture light, airy and delicate.

FRENCH JELLIES: 115 degrees. Texture clear, sparkling, transparent, free from blemishes and specks and tender.

TOFFEE: Pale straw colour. Should be able to see through it, non crystalline.

BREAD: Loaf must be correctly moulded to achieve good shape. Crust should be golden brown. Bloom, special sparkle from natural oils and sugars in flour. Volume, well risen from correctly ripened dough. Texture, white and fine. Crumb, white not grey. Wholemeal will be darker and courser. Flavour and Aroma, wholesome and not sour. Presentation, clean and neat.

NOTE: Cakes should not be iced or filled. Cookery, which can and has been frozen, should be defrosted 24 hrs prior to entry.

- 2. Afghan rug must consist of crochet squares, and any other rug should be entered as wool or felt rug.
- 3. Take care in finishing off garment, articles etc. Press carefully.
- 4. If articles are soiled, sponge carefully; **DO NOT WASH**, as work must be as new work
- 5. All work must be the bona fide work of the Exhibitor.
- 6. Soiled or otherwise out of condition articles will be disqualified.
- 7. No piece or work may be entered in more than one class and must not have won a prize at any previous Mossman Show.
- 8. Conceal the section, class and exhibitor's name on a piece of paper and attach unobtrusively to the back of the exhibit.
- 9. Exhibits other than Classes shown in this schedule can be accepted and new classes created at the discretion of the Stewards.
